- The winter consultation closed on 14 February.
- The spring consultation is expected to open on 11 May (for 8 weeks) and will seek views on:
 - How we will regulate adult social care and primary medical service providers from October 2017
 - How we will regulate new and complex providers
 - Fit and Provider Person Requirements for Directors
- Outcome of the Registering the Right Support consultation will now publish in May to allow time to address the issues raised in the high number of responses received.

- The text in the document has been finalised following co-production and National and Representative Organisations Group feedback, and the title has been confirmed as *Quality Matters*.
- National and Representative Organisations Group roundtable event with David Mowat MP on Tuesday 14th March.
- Launch event on 15th May with additional regional workshop events in Spring/Summer.

A range and quality of social care services comparable to those in the wider community.

Recognising:

- the complexity of the prison system
- other inspectorates' responsibilities
- access to service users

- April 2015 - joint framework and single inspection report
- Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Prisons "expectations" and CQC "key lines of enquiry"
- Significant step forward from single provider focus to holistic / integrated approach
- Requirement notices published in report and followed up with focused inspection.

- Timely assessment
- Adequate provision
- Collaborative working
- Care planning and review
- Staff support and training
