

What does e-Learning for Healthcare offer?

Health Education England e-Learning for Healthcare (HEE e-LfH) works in partnership with the NHS and professional bodies to support patient care by providing e-learning to educate and train the health and social care workforce. All content is nationally quality-assured and available free of charge to all relevant users in health and social care (including care homes run by the independent sector).

The programmes are available on the e-LfH Hub which records user activity, enabling learners to run reports on all their learning activity and build a transferable life-long learning portfolio. Access to the whole library of content is available 24/7 from any device with an internet connection.

How to access e-Learning for Healthcare programmes

- All social care staff

Access to e-LfH content is available to all social care staff in England whose employers are registered with the Skills for Care National Minimum Data Set for Social Care (NMDS-SC). Every employer providing NMDS-SC workforce information to Skills for Care has been given a user registration code for their staff. This code enables you to self-register for access to e-LfH resources. Please contact your employer for more details about the registration code. - Care home / hospice staff

There are two parts to the registration process:

1. Obtaining a registration code for the care home/hospice
2. Registration by members of staff who wish to use the e-LfH resources

1. Obtaining a registration code for the care home/hospice: Registration codes are issued by e-LfH for each care home/hospice (not for each organisation). To obtain this registration code **the manager should:**

- Go to: <https://portal.e-lfh.org.uk/support/>
- Select 'Registration' then 'Next'
- Complete the 'General Information' section with **their** name and email address
- Do not amend the fields that are marked 'Registration Query' or 'Additional Information'
- In the next section, under 'Subject Heading' enter *Request for care home/hospice registration code*
- In the 'Message' section enter the full name and address (including postcode) of the care home/hospice, and press 'Submit'

2. Registration by members of staff: You need to obtain the registration code for your care home/hospice **from your manager** before you can register. Once you have received the registration code you can register for access to the e-LfH Hub:

- Go to <https://portal.e-lfh.org.uk/Register>
- Enter your e-mail address
- Select 'I am a care home or hospice worker' (other options are available)

- Enter the postcode of the care home or hospice you work in and select the correct option from the drop-down list presented to you
 - Enter the registration code provided to you by your employer
 - Select 'Register'
 - Follow the instructions on the screen to complete your registration
 - You will receive an email with your username and password
 - Log in
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- Anyone eligible for an NHS OpenAthens account

You can access e-LfH content and a range of other content provided by the NHS via OpenAthens. To check your eligibility, and register for an NHS OpenAthens account, visit:

- If your organisation uses a Learning Management System to host and launch e-learning courses

Access to **some of our content** will be made available to external organisations to launch from their own Learning Management Systems (LMS) via the AICC e-learning session communication standard. This will enable the external LMS to record launching, duration, score and status of sessions held on e-LfH's content server.
